Marjorie Johnson Retires

A tribute by her son Paul

The Smithfield Bridge Club recently honored Marjorie Johnson for her long and colorful association with bridge. After managing the club for the past 20 years, she decided to retire and to hand over the duties to a younger person. The club elected Lee Johnson to take her place.

Marge's bridge career spans about 60 years. In the mid 1940's, when she was a young captain's wife in Tucson, Arizona, she was asked by the senior officers' wives to form a bridge club. That started a life-long involvement with the game. She followed her Air Force husband to many different places and always found friends of bridge everywhere they settled. Despite 56 years of living with rheumatoid arthritis, she has continued to find enjoyment in life and bridge. She has had many partners over the decades and has played with Ed Rabil for the past 20 or so years.

I am her son, Paul Johnson, and I am glad she lit the fire of my passion for bridge. In unit

119, she was the charity chairman for most of the 1980's and some of the 1990's. For Marge, we thank you for your selfless enthusiasm for our favorite sport.

Goldsboro Club Gets New Directors

The Goldsboro Bridge Club has three new certified directors. Mabel Edmonson announced in the spring that she was retiring in September. Then Lindy Gunderson's health forced him to slow down a little.

A mad scramble for directors ensued. A few good men stepped into the breach, and within months, they had taken the course work required for them to run a sanctioned game.

Billy Bizzell has "always liked cards." When he retired from his job as an independent insurance agent in 1994, he took up duplicate bridge with a passion. He and Mack Moore from Whittakers, NC, met in Greenville and formed a terrible twosome. In February 1999, the same week Billy caught a "great big old bass," he earned his Life Master status at a tournament in Myrtle Beach. The very next night, partner Mack earned his. Only three years later, Billy earned his Silver Life Master.

Tommy Franklin, a relative newcomer to the game, started playing as the result of a skiing accident which put a halt to his Wednesday night tennis game. Now tennis takes a backseat to bridge. In his other life before bridge, Tommy was executive vice president of Franklin Baking Company. Recently retired, Tommy has taken up bridge with a vengeance. He plays three or four times a week. Just recently he reached the level of Regional Master.

Dr. Kkrishna Prasad is a general surgeon who says he plays bridge to relax. He defines stress as "waiting in line at the Winn Dixie." Stress is definitely not part of Krishna's game. He is always smiling whether he is winning or losing, and he calls everybody, "ya'll." His work schedule prevents him from playing on Monday, but he directs the Wednesday night game with flair. "I just love this game," he declares.

All three men have brought their own style to the game. With humor, affection, and sometimes a little tyranny, Bizzell, Franklin and Prasad have earned the

respect and gratitude of the Goldsboro Bridge Club. The future of the club is in good hands.
