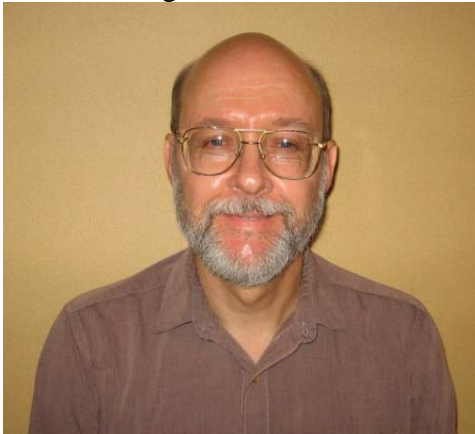

Many players became addicted to bridge in college. The joke was that you could tell the hard-core players from those who were not serious about the game. The ones who were not serious could step away from the game long enough to go to class.

According to the May 30 *News and Observer*, John Markey of the Raleigh Bridge Club said he took bridge lessons as a child and thought it was a miserable game. He changed his mind in college when he became so addicted to the game that he didn't go anywhere without cards. One night he and some friends were at a restaurant without cards, so they improvised a whole deck from the sugar packets on the table. They decorated the packs with spades, hearts, diamonds, and clubs, and numbered them two through ace. Now that's hard-core.

Markey is a certified public accountant who has two passions: the piano and bridge. About bridge he says, "This is a sport you really have to work at. But I just love it." Goldsboro players would agree with him.

It is very difficult to explain the game of bridge to a novice. In the same edition of the *News and Observer*, a one-paragraph explanation offered a clear and concise introduction to a newcomer: "Thirteen cards are dealt to each person, face down to four players. An auction is held in which each player, only able to see his or her cards, tries to communicate to a partner the strength and distribution of the hand. The winner of the auction is the team that contracts to win the highest number of tricks. That team then must win the number of tricks promised in the contract. The team that loses the auction tries to prevent the other team from making its goal by winning more tricks." Is that clear? Are you ready to play now?

The tough part about duplicate bridge is that all the foursomes are playing the same hands, so results are compared at the end of the game. It can be a very humbling experience. But it is also a very exciting experience. Nothing beats knowing you have played well and have understood your partner. No one can completely conquer the game, and that's why players keep coming back to the tables.

Piece of cake, right? Pull 3 rounds of trumps, cash 12 tricks. But if trumps split 2-2 or 3-1, you wouldn't be reading about this hand, would you?

Left Hand Opponent (LHO) continues with the 9 of spades to the Queen, the King, the Ace. When you play to the club Ace, LHO shows out. Ouch! You finesse the club 10, cash the club King, ruff a good diamond, and pull the last trump. Now you throw a heart and a spade on the top diamonds and make your contract.

The point of this hand is: if RHO ducks the Queen of spades, you need the heart finesse to make your contract. As the cards lie (full hand below), the finesse fails and you go down.

Should RHO duck, holding the King, 10, x(x)? Yes! Pard has not underled the Ace of spades, the setting trick. Maybe declarer's spade Ace is singleton, and even it isn't, nothing is lost by the duck.
