Goldsboro Bridge Club

“O.K., folks. The trough is closed.” Those words of director Krishnaprasad ringing through St. Stephen’s parish hall sent players scurrying back to their seats from the refreshment table one Monday. It was hard to stay away from Claire Starling’s homemade oatmeal cookies.

Mrs. Starling was celebrating the birth of not one, but two, great grandchildren within a week of each other. She had more reason to celebrate at the end of the game when she and partner Dot McKemie finished first overall.

Those really were good cookies. Barbara Ann Vinson brought one back from the refreshment table to enjoy. When she put it down on the bridge table to arrange her cards, Tommy Franklin said, “Are you really going to eat that cookie after it has been sitting on that nasty table? Why don’t I just drop it on the floor if you want it dirty?”

Opponent Shelby Bizzell said, “Well, you could take a bite and then hand it back to her.”

Franklin was indignant. “Are you insinuating that my mouth is dirtier than the floor?”

Mrs. Bizzell didn’t miss a beat. “Tommy,” she said, “I have heard your mouth.” Score one for Mrs. Bizzell.

July 17

Many thanks to Billy Bizzell for directing the 13½-table game on July 16. He was ably assisted by Tommy Franklin and by Sandy Allen, who fed the names and scores into the computer. The Goldsboro Bridge Club is lucky to have five active certified directors. Without certified directors the game would not be sanctioned by the American Contract Bridge League and no master points could be awarded.

Directing is a thankless job. Even when a director is reading the rule straight from the rulebook, many times a player will argue that the ruling is not fair. It is especially difficult to direct and play at the same time. When a director is interrupted in the play of his hand and summoned to settle a question, it is hard for him to regain his concentration and remember what he was doing at his own table. But on Monday Bizzell managed to both come in first N/S and direct at the same time. The club really appreciates its five directors: Audrey Solberg and Sue Wilson, who are also ACBL teachers, Billy Bizzell, Tommy Franklin, and Krishnaprasad. The game would not be possible without you.

Last week President Libba Sutton reminded players of bridge etiquette. North is the player who scores the hand and puts the traveling score sheet back into the board. The other players should wait until North has finished with all his/her duties and has turned the board which has been played over and put the new board on top before pulling his/her new hand from the board. That’s just common sense and good manners.

July 24

How much is too much to go down? You almost have to be a mathematician to figure it out. If opponents have a sure small slam and are vulnerable, they can get a 1430 score. If you have a long diamond suit and are not vulnerable, should you bid seven diamonds and risk being doubled? Quick! Do the math. If you go down six doubled, opponents still get only 1400. That would be a top board if all other opponents bid and made six spades.

The late Lindy Gunderson was a master at this kind of defensive bidding. And it paid off for him more times than not. When it didn’t, he would shake his head, and mutter, “Too much, too much.”

Defense is as much a part of bridge as offense. Sometimes you just don't get any good cards and all you can do is pass. In Monday's 15½ table game, East/West had all the cards. Out of 26 boards, North/South bid game only five times. But that's the beauty of duplicate bridge. You can still win if you defend better than the other people playing the same hands.

July 31

Remember those little ditties that you learned when you first started playing bridge? Little rhymes like "Third in hand, play high as you can," "Against no trump, lead fourth from high in your longest and strongest," "When dummy's on your right, lead the lowest suit in sight." Remember those?

Sometimes they work and sometimes they don't. One dictum that doesn't even rhyme is "Second in hand, play low." This may be the hardest rule to follow. If you know you can take the trick and cash in another trick or two after that, it's really hard to play low and hope your partner can take the trick.

On Monday, North was in a three no trump contract, and she did not want West to get the lead and lead clubs through her remaining jack/little club, so she led a small diamond from the ace in her hand toward the jack on the board, hoping against hope that East would take the trick with either the king or the queen of diamonds and then lead his ace of clubs to make her jack stand up. She had taken the club queen with her king on the first trick. East took the bait and played his king of diamonds, then followed with his ace of clubs, thus allowing North to make her bid. All West said was, "Second in hand, play low."

August 6

Summerfest (August 5) was a big success, drawing two sections of 11 tables each for a night of socializing, eating, and playing bridge. Everyone was glad to see Ed and Dayle Pond, who came for supper. Tom Knutson played with Krishnaprasad, and George and Miriam Martin from Greenville came, too.

President Libba Sutton welcomed everyone and thanked Ray Gunderson and Virginia Mansour, who collected the money; Terry Hampton, who donated the beautiful roses gracing each table; and Walnut Creek for doing such a good job on the delicious

dinner. There were almost as many players from out of town as there were from Goldsboro.

Marie from Wilmington directed the game with her usual good humor and grace. At the end of the game "The Boys," as they are called, had racked up an unbelievable percentage of over 70%, finishing first overall. The boys are Gil Olafsson and Ray Neeland from Wilson. They play in Goldsboro occasionally on Wednesday; and when they show up, everyone knows they are probably going to win. Congratulations to them on an outstanding game Sunday night.

August 21

Despite the best efforts of Bill Gates and Warren Buffet, bridge is really not a young people's game. They have too much other stuff to do.
